to protect, conserve and nurture Muskoka's natural and cultural environment now and for future generations.







WHAT ARE SPECIES AT RISK?

There are 5 classifications for species at risk in Ontarior

	STATUS	DEFINITION
	Extinct (Ext)	a native species that no longer lives according in the world.
	Extirpated (Exp)	a native species that no longer exists in the wild in Ontario, but still exist absorbers.
	Endangered (End)	a native species facing estitiction of estimation
A P	Threatened (Thr)	a netive species at risk of becoming endangered if steps are not takes to abbress factors throutening it.
	Special Concern (Sc)	a native species that is sensitive to human activities or natural events, which may cause it to become endangered or threatened.



	Highlight loss (Wettlends are being filled to, firesits out, and grasslands plooghed and ferross)	Competition from other species (invesive & introduced)
ı	Habitat fragmentation (roads, devel- spment)	Pollution & Chemicals

- Maintain your well and septic system
- Correctly take a water sample
- Save water in your home
- Take care of an abandoned well
- Protect your community's groundwater

- Opportunity to ask specific questions about your well and septic
- Free Well Aware kit and publications
- Septic safety information and tips to avoid costly repair bills
